Section A: JOINTLY DEVELOPED

H.B. Hackett School will take the following actions to involve parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs, including opportunities for regular meetings, if requested by parents, to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible.

- In an effort to strengthen family and school partnerships, H.B. Hackett has formed strong relationships with the Beacon and Block Churches. Working collaboratively with the Beacon Church, an after school reading and writing program to enhance student achievement was developed. It has had a positive impact on student engagement and fostered a love for reading and writing. The Block Church has supported Hackett School with a school paper drive where each teacher was provided two cases of paper. Volunteers organized opportunities to clean and declutter the school environment. Along with the school, they co-hosted a Thanksgiving Feast which brought families and school community together.
